# **Stay Consistent Across Lessons**

Use the same basic layout and sections in each lesson within a course. This helps students focus on the content instead of relearning how to navigate every time.



# Co-Create a Template with the SME

Collaborate with your subject matter expert to build a shared template. Agree on structure and a centralized place to store content—it saves time and prevents confusion later.



# Mix Text with Interactivity

Alternate text with interactive blocks like accordions, flashcards, and click-to-reveal elements. This keeps learners engaged and helps reinforce key concepts.



# **Keep Lessons Under 45 Minutes**

Since learners can't save progress once a Rise lesson is embedded in the LMS, keep each lesson concise and achievable—ideally under 45 minutes.



# **Use Frequent Knowledge Checks**

Incorporate knowledge check blocks throughout the lesson. These low-stakes questions prompt learners to stay active and monitor their own understanding.



# Start with Clear Learning Objectives

Begin each lesson with a short list of what learners will be able to do by the end. Clear objectives give purpose and direction—and help shape the rest of your content.



## Use Relevant, High-Quality Visuals

Visuals should support the learning, not just decorate the screen. Choose clean, relevant images and icons that help clarify or reinforce the material.



## Design with Mobile in Mind

Many learners access Rise lessons on phones or tablets. Keep text brief, use vertical-friendly layouts, and test on multiple devices for a smooth experience.



## Guide the Learner's Journey

Use buttons, dividers, and section headers to create a clear flow. Help learners understand where they are and what's next at every step of the lesson.



## **Invite Feedback and Reflection**

Include prompts or open-ended questions at the end to encourage reflection. Link to discussion forums or feedback forms if your platform allows.
